President's Report 2019

2019 was a year we should celebrate; in that we came Second in the Club Championship! To achieve that sterling result, we won the Colts Club Championship; won a Third Grade Premiership, we had Second and Fourth Grades in the Semi Finals, along with Firsts and Thirds Colts, with Seconds Colts losing a tremendously tight match in the GF. The turnaround in 12 months, from 2018, was simply outstanding, and all should be congratulated on working together to help put this great club back where it belongs.

In 2019 we set about executing the three year strategic plan that the board endorsed. It was a plan that pushed the boundaries and put the club outside its comfort zone -not only financially, but also in the many changes required to set the foundations for this club to grow again. We registered 40 players and Lucas Thiessen successfully navigated between the 15 's and 7's programs throughout the season with the support of his team. Next year we have separated the program with Lucas managing the 15's and Chris Cooper managing the 7's. Women's Rugby is the fastest growing sport in Australia and we need to lead the way, as we want to be a club that is a leader in the Shute Shield and on the Australian rugby landscape. Congratulations to those Gordon Gazelles for being the first team to represent Gordon in 15 a side and for leading the way in inspiring women to play rugby.

Sometimes, unless you are closely involved with an organisation, you take for granted how the wheels keep spinning. In my time as President I've met so many inspiring people who keep the Club functioning - the wheels spinning. Our volunteers are amazing. I want to thank all these dedicated people, because, without their time and generosity, we would not be able to exist. Thank you very much.

I would like to thank the board - Vanessa Gliddon, Tony Cooper, Andrew Heaven, Gianni Valente, and Tim Wedlock for their enormous contribution to the club throughout the year. Thank you also to Mark Hartill for his contribution in 2019 and we were sad to have him leave the Board in October. I want to particularly thank Tony, who will be stepping down as Treasurer. His contribution is much appreciated.

I would like to welcome Gareth James to the board. He will be taking over as Treasurer in 2020. Gareth has worked as a CFO and is an experienced, results-driven, finance executive with extensive experience in the areas of finance, governance, business development and strategic planning. On behalf of the Club I extend a warm welcome to Gareth tonight, and we look forward to your involvement with Gordon.

Special thanks to Shane Sullivan, who has done a tremendous job as GM of Gordon. Shane arrived at Gordon during the season and he faced the challenge of settling in very quickly. But he managed extremely

well, and we can't thank him enough for the tireless commitment and dedication he puts into the club. Thank you, Shane.

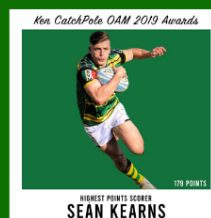


CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP RISE

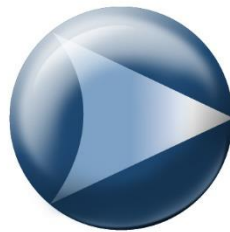

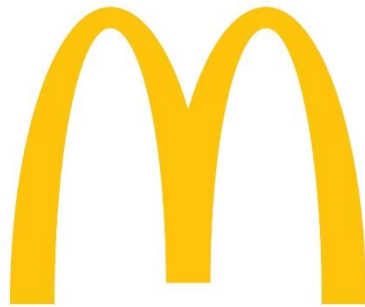

It is with much pleasure, on behalf of the FOGS Committee, we write to you with your Annual Report on the activities of the Friends of Gordon "FOGS" Alumni for the 2019 season.

Chairman's Overview

The net result for 2019 is one (1) Premiership, two (2) Minor Premierships, two (2) Grand Final appearances, six (6) out of seven (7) teams making Semi-Final appearances, second place finish in the overall Club Championship and our first Colts' Club Championship in many, many years. We have also seen the gradual rise and development of our women's program and, perhaps from a long-term perspective, the most important of all has been the growing re-connection between the club and the Gordon Juniors.

I am sure, when the Friends of Gordon were established back in 2012, none of us envisioned it would take a further seven (7) years before we could claim another premiership. As all of you who followed the club's fortunes (especially in the last decade or so) will know, we never seemed to be more than touching distance away from premiership success. Nevertheless, premierships don't grow on trees and they are not won unless there is a very significant "buy in" from everybody in the club. Having quality players and quality coaches doesn't hurt either.

Naturally, the highlight of the season is the Grand Final victory by Third Grade, so ably coached by Tony Dempsey, Bernie Rorke and Brett O'Neill, with significant input from Phil Scarr and Mark Hartill. It is perhaps no surprise our most successful team in 2019 has been one coached by players from our most successful era of recent times: the 1990's. For those who were there, but can't remember, we won three (3) Premierships and featured in four (4) First Grade Grand Finals, together with a good number of lower Grade premierships.

It is an old sporting truism; winners know how to win. Notwithstanding their own coaching skills, the fact the Third-Grade coaching group all experienced the coaching talents of people Chris Hawkins, John Warr and Alec Evans at club level and other illustrious coaches at representative level should not be overlooked. Success involves both playing and coaching talent.

At the start of the season, I always thought our Second Grade and Third Grade sides and Second Grade Colts were the most likely teams to win Premierships this year. Whilst we would have loved to win seven (7) titles, the Grand Final loss by Second Grade Colts is perhaps the hardest to take as the boys only lost one game during the regular season and were playing in their second straight Grand Final. Hopefully, the result is something that will spur them all on to bigger and better things in the years ahead especially as they progress into Grade.

The really pleasing thing about the Third-Grade result was the number of Gordon juniors who were playing and, in particular, the number of Gordon players such as Andrew Chapman, the team Captain, and Hugh Cropley who have stuck with the club through thick and thin over many years. It is great they have finally received the reward which they so richly deserve. There is also a nice bit of symmetry about the fact Andrew's father Hilton played in our first Colts' Premiership winning team in 1974 and Andrew has now helped to break another significant drought in our club's history.

On behalf of the FOGs, I would like to thank Darren Coleman and all of the coaching staff in Grade and David Telfer and all of the coaching staff in Colts for providing the opportunity to so many of our young players to play finals football (for a good number of them for the first time) and for showing the players what a united and successful club can do for them, its members and supporters.

In terms of FOG's activities during the year, I note that Peter Sherwood (our tireless secretary) has provided comprehensive details of these throughout the year, but summaries are also included in this report. As importantly, of course, a summary of how funds (which you have so generously contributed throughout the year and previously) have been applied forms an integral part of this Annual Report. None of it has been

spent for the personal benefit of the FOGs and all has been carefully applied to: enhance the club's position as the club of choice for junior footballers on the North Shore; to enhance the club's rugby program; and to do what we can to assist the playing and coaching staff achieve their full potential, both on the rugby field and in life generally.

The commitment from the FOGs ever since we started has been to: ensure the club did not disappear as a result of the problems which were present prior to 2012; that we once again became the club of choice for all aspiring rugby players on the North Shore; that we had a rugby program equal to any club in Sydney; that the club could provide a pathway for aspirational players to achieve their full potential as rugby players; and, that everybody playing for or associated with the club could achieve their potential, both in rugby and in life.

As with any organisation whose effectiveness and successes (or failures) all depend on the people involved, FOG's is entirely the product of you the members and the Committee. None of what we do for the club could happen without the time, the skills, the loyalty and the commitment of the Committee. In no particular order, I'd like to thank each and every one of Peter Sherwood, Peter Matthews, Peter Bull, Peter Black, Brett Fawcett, Andrew Dainton, High Trollope, Ivo Clarke and Al Kirkby. They are all true Gordon people and, along with Tim Wedlock (our Board liaison person) and Rick Seton (the voice of reason), have contributed in no small way to FOG's and the club this year.
