Our Grade Sevens team swept the competitions with wins in Lake Macquarie and the prestigious Kiama Sevens Tournaments.

We had key people and players in place to ensure success throughout our Grade, Colts and Women's Programs.

I will let Brian, Matt, and the respective coaches give you more information about the on-field Season, but I am very proud of how all our teams played. Treasurer's Report

GARETH JAMES – THE 12 MONTHS ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2022



At last year's AGM, we reported a profit of \$85,726. Contributing significantly to that result was the Covid shortened season which stopped the competition in mid-June 2021 and resulted in significantly lower operating costs for the year. Whilst we are delighted that the 2022 season was completed and we had a very successful finals run, this resulted in significantly higher operating costs than in prior years, as a result of increases in player costs, support staff costs, and other game day expenses. We are reporting a loss for the year of \$17,187 compared to a profit in 2021 of \$85,726.

We have a number of key sources of revenue to support the operations of GRFC including sponsorship, Foundation contributions, player registrations, memberships and game day income (admission, bar and canteen).

We are extremely grateful to the Foundation which provided \$84,000 of support for various expense categories in accordance with the charter of the Australian Sports Foundation. Our sponsors generously contributed in excess of \$580,000 through either cash contributions or provision of goods and services. We would not be able to operate without the ongoing support of both our sponsors and the Foundation. We continue to work hard to provide value to and to support our existing sponsors and find new sponsors. We offer a wonderful game day experience for our sponsors and all new sponsorship enquiries are very welcome.

Despite being the reigning Premiers leading into the 2022 season and also having a wonderfully successful run into the 2022 final series, our game day attendances were disappointing, with only our home games against Norths and Warringah providing significant game day income. In fact, we held 9 home matches and those 2 provided over half of the total game day revenue in the season. We understand that there continued to be concern regarding Coronavirus, the weather was not perfect and there were competing events (i.e. Waratahs) on a few occasions, but the attendance for 7 of our 9 games was very disappointing and does impact the financial well-being of the club. We receive no income for telecast rights whatsoever.

Treasurer's Report (cont)

Our membership revenue was also disappointing, with little increase over prior years despite our success on the field. We will again be making a concerted effort to lift our membership base in 2023 and all support from current members in spreading the word would be very welcome.

Our player registration income in 2022 was also the lowest it has been in 5 years, and we are putting in processes in 2023 to ensure that we capture registration fees for all players.

We held a very successful and enjoyable GRFC luncheon in June and raised over \$40,000 in profits through the lunch and auction items. As you can see from our overall result, this is a very important event on our calendar and needs all the support it can get in terms of attendance and donations to the auction.

In addition to the annual luncheon, we also held a sponsor's lunch, a grand final players breakfast, an awards night and also a golf day. Whilst each of these are very important and enjoyable, they do not contribute any material earnings to our club.

Taking all the above into account, our consolidated trading revenue in 2022 was \$1.08M (2021:\$941K) up 15% on 2021.

Our total operating overhead in 2022 (including cost of sales) was \$1.2M (2021: \$923k). As mentioned, the significant increase over 2021 is due to the extended season and our successful run to the Grand Final. With the ever-increasing professionalism in the game, together with the significant increases in CPI, our costs have increased across the board.

It is a fact that most of our costs are semi fixed and not discretionary. To compete at Shute Shield level, we need to make player payments, engage with appropriate medical, physio and other support staff, as well as game day staff to meet the numerous regulations and laws we need to adhere to host a match at Chatswood Oval. Our player payments in 2022 were significantly higher than they have ever been before (noting that 2020 and 2021 were shortened seasons). Other costs that have increased over prior years include ground hire, game day support, physio, S&C, to name just a few.

Treasurer's Report (cont)

We are committed to investing in the future of the club. A key component in improving the competitiveness and relationships across all levels of our club has been the appointment of Josh Mitchell into the role of Pathways Director. Josh will be working to solidify the connection between our junior clubs, Colts, Grade, Women's and UTS. He has already achieved some very important steps since undertaking this role. His salary is contributed to by the Gordon junior clubs for a 12-month period as well as a small contribution from the Federal Government in the form of a BAC Claim.

As of 31 October 2022, the Club has cash available of \$149,721 (FY 2021: \$213,769), and this resides within the Club's primary bank accounts with CBA, Suncorp, and Bendigo Banks.

As previously noted, we very much appreciate the support from all our Club sponsors and the Foundation. Quite simply, the club cannot exist without you.

The Financial Statements (FY 2022) have been tabled and will be lodged with ASIC. We thank Mark Arthur of Crispin & Jeffery, and his team, for preparing and auditing our annual Financial Statements. Crispin & Jeffery have also very kindly agreed to also take on the day-to-day accounting, a time consuming task, for the 2023 season. I and the Board are extremely grateful for the accounting support that has previously been generously provided by Glascott Landscape through Ben Ledwidge. Thank you Matt and Ben.

We look forward to 2023 with optimism, quietly confident that with the ongoing support of our sponsors, members, and the Friends of Gordon Foundation, we will consolidate our financial position in 2023.
